Back in 1937 Mass Observation was founded to study the everyday lives of ordinary people in Britain with the aim of creating an 'anthropology of ourselves'. A panel of volunteers recorded their daily observations of life around them, and the project has subsequently become well known through its activities in the Second World War. The project faltered in the 1950s but was revived in 1981 and continues even now.

We don't yet know how the history of the current unprecedented times will be written, but there are already a host of commentaries and bulletins on the impact of the COVID-19 virus and, more particularly, the measures taken to contain and treat it.

For our part, we are capturing the personal experience of management consultants using a Mass Observation approach. Towards the end of the year we hope to publish a digest of the reflections of a panel of management consultants in respect of the work they are doing, the challenges facing their clients, and their thoughts particularly on the 'new normal' that might emerge – or has already emerged. We are calling this initiative Project Moneta, after the Roman goddess of memory
